Data retention

Where data processing is carried out on our behalf by a third party, we take steps to ensure that appropriate security measures are in place to prevent unauthorised disclosure of personal data.

What are your rights?

Access

You have the right to request us to provide you details of the personal information we hold about you. We may also charge a 'reasonable fee' to comply with requests for further copies of the same information. This does not mean that we will charge for all subsequent access requests. Data portability
